### Who We Are

Serving Madison and Dane County since 1992, Wheels for Winners is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that supports bicycling through a well-recognized earn-a-bike program and related activities. Working with community organizations and schools, we provide refurbished bicycles to bike riders of all ages who earn their bikes by performing community service. Our all-volunteer organization believes that equitable access to a bicycle is an important component of a strong, vibrant, healthy community. Our programs encourage volunteerism, recycle unused bicycles, and support cycling as part of a healthy lifestyle.

### Message from the President

#### Stephen Bagwell

Wheels for Winners has been in the Madison community for 27 years as an organization to get bikes into the community and to get people on those bikes. Over the years, we have become increasingly mindful of our obligation to the community and our role within it. Providing bikes to people is important, but only if the people earning the bikes think it important. In 2019, we made an effort to actively engage and be present with the communities we serve in order to be informed by them rather than the other way around. Our central mission is still to refurbish bikes and get them back out to people, but as we move forward we are focusing more on social commitment to ensure our work



remains valuable to the community. Our bike repair events are a response to feedback from our community partners.

We are adjusting our board model to be more directed by the community. We are continuing to increase our regular presence in the communities we serve—creating personal embedded relationships is a big part of this. In 2019 we increased our visibility and maintenance events so that

once people have the bikes, they stay in service and the earners can continue to be engaged with us. We are also expanding our shop hours to be more flexible for families. As we move forward, it is very important to us to be supportive to our communities rather than attempting to drive change. The people in these communities are able to do that themselves, and we want to support that rather than take it over.

# **Community Involvement**
